	<p>Monday Revisit your Pirate number cards. Use them to help you count to 20! Practice your counting. Can you start from a different number and count to 10, then 20? For example: 4,5,6,7,8,9,10 or 12,13,14,15,16,17,18,19,20</p>		<p>Monday Look at the picture of 'Big bloomers bay' on frog in resources. What can you see on the sand? Who do the footprints belong to? What do you think the Pirates are saying? Tell your grown-ups.</p>		
	<p>Tuesday: Pirate maths! Use the pirate maths playdough sheets to find how many coins you need. (You can download them on frog) If you don't have playdough, why not draw pirate coins to use instead. Challenge: Can you make up your own number of coins and then count them altogether?</p>		<p>Tuesday: Look at the picture of 'Long John's Bridge'. Tell your grown up what is happening in the picture. Look at the Pirates faces. Are they happy? What do you think they are saying? Look at the crocodiles, what do you think they might be saying? Tell your grown-ups.</p>		
	<p>Wednesday Pirate number ordering. Using the pirate treasure chests on frog, place the number treasure chests around your garden or home. Encourage your child to find them and put them</p>		<p>Wednesday Look at the picture of the cave on frog in resources. Tell your grown-up what you can see in the cave. How would you feel if you went into the cave? Tell your grown-up.</p>		

	<p>in the correct order. (you can always make your own if you prefer) Ask the following questions: Can you find them and help me put them in number order? What number is on the treasure chest you found? How many coins are inside? What number would this chest go next to? What number chest would come next? Yo, ho, ho! 	<p>Thursday You will need: A selection of toys/ pirate coins. A drawn large circle or use a large box. Pirate number cards. Activity: Pick a number card. Put the matching number of objects into the circle. Take 2 objects away from the circle. Count how many you have left in the circle. Tell your grown-up. Repeat activity with different number cards.</p>		<p>Thursday Listen to the story of 'Pirates love underpants', again. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Vd8Y1bEzA8 https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ZQMBef8nwzo Listen to the story again. Tell your grown-up what you liked best about the story and why. Draw a picture of your favourite part. With support from your grown-up, have a go at labelling your picture. Remember to listen for the sounds in the words. Show your grow-up. Was there anything you did not like about the story?</p>
