

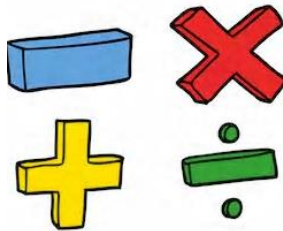
Maths homework

Use a pillowcase as a sack to have a sack race with a family member! Count how many jumps you can do without falling over!



Label 5 shopping bags with any number. Lay them out and open them up. Throw 2 soft balls/toys into the bags. What will be your highest score?

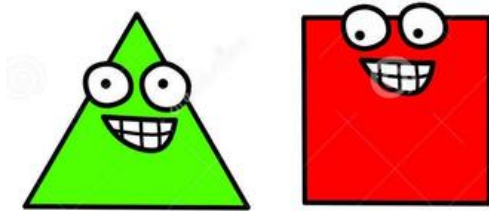
How many fingers, toes, eyes and ears are there in your family? Use these numbers to create your own addition, subtraction and multiplication sentences.



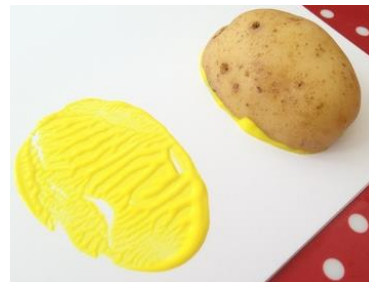
Make 5 number cards, each with a single number on. How many 2-digit numbers can you make with these numbers? (eg, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5- 12, 23, 34, 51 etc) Challenge- How many - digit numbers can you make? Make it competition for all the family!



Look through an old magazine or catalogue. Cut out all the pictures of things that are square, triangle, rectangular and circular. Stick them in the same shape groups to make a pretty collage of 2D shapes.



Ask an adult to help you cut a 2D shape into a potato. Then use the potato to dip into paint and make repeated patterns on paper.



Get to know your left and right by using a scarf as a blindfold and guiding an older sibling or adult around the house by using position and direction language. Make sure they don't bump into anything!



Play shops! Use the coins in your money box and label your toys with price tags. What can you buy with your money?
